





All Year 11 and 12 students at BrisbaneSDE must be on track to graduate with a QCE.



Studies that can contribute towards a QCE

- General Subjects
- Applied subjects
- Vocational education and training (VET) courses
- QCAA short courses
- School-based apprenticeships and traineeships
- University subjects completed while at school
- Workplace learning
- Recognised Studies (e.g. AMEB, Duke of Edinburgh)



How does the QCE work?

To receive a QCE, you must achieve 20 credits of learning, at the set standard, in a set pattern, while meeting literacy and numeracy requirements.

Typically, students will study six subjects/courses across Years 11 and 12. Many students choose to include vocational education and training (VET) courses in their QCE pathway and some may also wish to extend their learning through university courses or other recognised study. In some cases, students may start VET or other courses in Year 10.

Set amount 20 credits from contributing courses of study, including:

- QCAA-developed subjects or courses
- · vocational education and training qualifications
- · non-Queensland studies
- · recognised studies.



12 credits from completed Core courses of study and 8 credits from any combination of:

- Core
- Preparatory (maximum 4)
- · Complementary (maximum 8).



Satisfactory completion, grade of C or better, competency or qualification completion, pass or equivalent.



Students must meet literacy and numeracy requirements through one of the available learning options.





20 credits from contributing courses of study, including:

- QCAA-developed subjects or courses
- vocational education and training qualifications
- non-Queensland studies
- recognised studies.



Satisfactory completion, grade of C or better, competency or qualification completion, pass or equivalent. Each subject has 4 units, worth one credit each.

You only get the credit if you pass the unit.


The credits are awarded individually for units one and two.
(1 credit for each unit passed).

The credits are awarded as a pair for units three and four.

(2 credits for a C or above at the end of Year 12, no credits if you get a D or below.)


12 credits from completed Core courses of study and 8 credits from any combination of:

- Core
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- · Complementary (maximum 8).


12 of the 20 credits must come from subjects/courses that you have **completed** – i.e. you have done all four units, or the whole VET qualification.

Remember – you only get credits from the units you pass.




How do I set up an interview?

- Prepare to be available during times over the dates Wednesday 30th, Thursday 31st July, and Friday 1st August
- SET-P interviewers will send out a scheduled interview to you and your student.
- Confirm a 30 minute time slot with the interviewer.
 - If the time is suitable, confirm by approving the invitation
 - If the time is not suitable, contact the interviewer to request a change.
 - Provide 3 x 30 minute alternative time slots that would suit you within the three interview days.
 - Interviewer will provide a revised calendar invitation for the interview.




What are the Options for Students once they either turn 16 or finish Year 10 if they want to leave school?

 $_{I}$ BrisbaneSDE

When a young person stops being of compulsory school age (16 years) or finishes Year 10, they enter the **Compulsory Participation Phase.** During this phase, a young person can leave school, however, they must be 'earning or learning' until they turn 17 or they achieve their QCE / QCIA

What does 'earning or learning' look like?

- Staying at school, completing Year 11 and 12
 - > QCE / QCIA
 - > ATAR
 - VET course (eg: Tafe@School)
 - School-based traineeship / apprenticeship
- ➤ A VET course at TAFE Certificate III or higher
- An apprenticeship or traineeship (non school-based)
- > Paid employment for at least 25 hours a week
- Government employment skills development programs (eg: Get Set For Work, Skilling Qlders for Work)
- > Other Schools of Distance Education
- Unilearn
- > Alternative School Options

Seize your opportunity with Fee-Free TAFE

Certificate 3 Guarantee

The Certificate 3 Guarantee is a state government subsidy designed to help working-age Queenslanders get their first post-school certificate III qualification.

How to get your hands on Fee-Free TAFE funding



To be eligible for Fee-Free TAFE funding, you must be:

- an Australian or New Zealand citizen or Australian permanent resident (including humanitarian entrants),
 or a temporary resident with the necessary visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency
- a Queensland resident
- · aged 15 years or older and no longer at school
- · not currently enrolled in another qualification.
- not have previously completed a Fee-Free TAFE funded qualification (students are only eligible to complete one Fee-Free TAFE funded qualification from 2023 to 2026)

Students from the following priority groups are strongly encouraged to apply:

- First Nations Australians
- young people aged 17-24
- · people out of work or receiving income support
- unpaid carers
- · women facing economic insecurity
- women undertaking study in non-traditional fields
- people with disability.

A couple of things about TAFE post Year 10 (or once a young person is 16)



- 1. In order to satisfy the requirements for the Compulsory Participation Stage of Education, it must be at least a **CERT III**
- 2. TAFE and University Pathways

Certificate	Selection Rank (ATAR equivalent)	
CERT III	Minimum 68 (may have to do a Diploma at University before moving into a Bachelor Program	NOTE These are just general
CERT IV Diploma	Minimum 74 Minimum 87 for most universities (UQ/BOND 82)	guidelines. Different universities have different rules around accepting a VET course for entry.

3. TAFE have their main intakes in January and July each year. So, if your young person has turns 16 before the July intake, and TAFE is something they are interested in, and they are desperate to leave school, then it is certainly worth considering now (depending on the entry requirements of the course).



Alternative School Options



Special Assistance Schools serve young people who are disengaged from education and whose needs are not met by mainstream schools or education services.

These schools offer an alternative pathway to achieving a QCE and offer the opportunity to complete VET Certificates. Some provide an ATAR pathway

They usually a smaller student population and much larger teacher:student ratio and offer Individual programs

A lot more flexibility is offered to cater for individual student needs and learning styles as well as options for social interactions

Most are free to attend or have a small cost associated with them and many provide meals (breakfast and lunch)

Most of them would be able to offer students the opportunity to do some General Subjects (through CairnsSDE) if these are required for prerequisites for university.


