Apprenticeships & Traineeships



A School Based Apprenticeship may be just what you are looking for

A School-Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship (SAT) lets you start a trade or career while you're still at school. You'll usually do:

- 1 day at work
- 4 days at school
- Plus a formal course through TAFE or a training provider (this fits in with your school and work timetable)

Why it's good:

- Get real job experience early
- Start your qualification before finishing school
- Provides a pathway straight into a full-time job after Year 12

Things to think about:

- Try work experience first to make sure it's right for you
- You'll need to balance school, work and training
- Traineeships can often be finished at school but apprenticeships usually continue full-time after you graduate.

You'll also need to apply standards like AS/NZS 3000 and AS/NZS 3008. The competition will be held at CQUni Mackay Ooralea and Rockhampton City campuses. To be eligible you must:

- Be undertaking an apprenticeship or traineeship in an Australian RTO/TAFE/University
- Be undertaking studies towards a qualification at an Australian RTO/TAFE or University
- Undertaken/completed a relevant qualification at an Australian RTO/TAFE or University

Explore myfuture

It's all about matching your interests and strengths to real careers. Have a look around and save anything that grabs your attention. Is uni the best pathway for every Year 12?

Short answer: No — it's a good option but not the only one. Recent research reported by [ABC News](#) found that:

- Many students feel pressure to go to uni, even if their career doesn't need it
- This pressure can lead to stress, burnout and anxiety
- Researchers say uni is a "great option" — but not for everyone

What research is showing

- A study linked to the [Australian National University](#) found:
 - Students are facing major pressure around study, careers and money
 - More students are now considering TAFE and other pathways
- Other research shows young people often feel uni is seen as the “best” or only option, even when it’s not required

What this means for students

- Uni is great for some careers (like law, medicine, teaching, engineering)
- But for others, you can go through:
 - TAFE
 - Apprenticeships
 - Traineeships
 - Straight into work

The key message: Don’t choose uni just because you feel pressured — choose the pathway that actually fits your career goals and how you like to learn.

School subjects and how they relate to job options

A good way to start exploring careers is to list jobs you might be interested in. An easy starting point:

- Think about the school subjects you enjoy most
- Check out the [Bullseye Posters on myfuture](#):
 - They match subjects to real jobs
 - They show heaps of career ideas you might not know about
 - They group jobs into 4 qualification levels (so you can see different pathways)

It’s a simple way to connect what you like at school to possible future careers.

Tertiary courses and providers are not all the same!

Not all courses or training providers are the same, so it’s important to do your research before you choose. Key tips:

- Think about what job you want and how to get there
- Compare courses and providers before spending money
- Pick something that suits your learning style and goals
- Use helpful resources like JobJumpstart

Year 10 - Start your career journey

In Year 10, you'll start thinking about careers, subjects and your future — and that's totally normal. A good place to start is the Queensland Department of Education [video on career education](#) — it's quick and gives you a solid overview. Key ideas:

- It's okay if you don't know what you want to do yet
- There are heaps of jobs and pathways you probably haven't even heard of
- Start exploring different careers early so you choose senior subjects that will get you on the right path

The earlier you start thinking and researching, the easier subject selection will be — and you'll usually do better in subjects you know will get you where you want to go career wise - and you actually enjoy. The quicker you start, the more confident you will become.

ABS Labour Force Data - March 2026

The Australian Bureau of Statistics have released the [Labour Force Data for March 2026](#):

- unemployment rate remained at 4.3%.
- participation rate decreased to 66.8%.
- employment increased to 14,762,800.
- employment to population ratio remained at 64.0%.
- underemployment rate remained at 5.9%.
- monthly hours worked increased to 2,015 million.
- full-time employment increased by 52,500 to 10,174,400 people.
- part-time employment decreased by 34,600 to 4,593,300 people.

The residential construction industry

The residential construction industry covers everything from building new homes to renovating existing ones — from houses to large apartment complexes. It's a major part of Australia's economy and provides lots of jobs. The industry needs more skilled workers like electricians, carpenters, plumbers and bricklayers. This means there are strong job opportunities but also a growing need to attract and train more people to fill these roles. [Click here for more info](#) on:

- Current labour force - Residential construction is a huge part of the economy, but it's short on workers. Demand is high, but not enough people are entering or finishing apprenticeships, and there's low participation from women, migrants and diverse groups.
- Labour and skill demands - Even though job vacancies have dropped a bit, construction still has major long-term worker shortages. To meet the National Housing Accord goals, the industry will need at least 83,000 more tradies by 2029.
- Looking forward - Australia's construction industry is stepping up to fix worker shortages by changing its culture, getting more women involved, and building stronger training pathways for future workers.

Financial Assistance & Scholarships



General Scholarships and financial assistance

Uni can get expensive (fees, books, rent, tech), so it's important to know your money options. You've got two main ways to get help:

- Scholarships (free money you don't pay back)
- Financial support (like government payments or loans)

Prac component of your uni course - how to survive!

You might be able to get extra money from the government while you're studying — not just HELP loans. Options include:

- [Prac Payment](#) (CPP)
From July 2025, helps you financially while doing unpaid placements for your course -)Bachelor in Teaching, Nursing, Midwifery, Social Work or Diploma in Nursing
- [Tertiary Access Payment](#) (TAP) (scroll down)
Up to \$5,000 if you move from regional/remote areas for uni
- [Other support through Services Australia](#) (scroll down) includes:
 - Youth Allowance
 - Austudy / ABSTUDY
 - Rent Assistance

There's more support out there than most people realise, so it's worth checking what you're eligible for.

What is HECS

Understanding HECS is important if you're starting uni in Australia. HECS-HELP is a loan from the Australian Government that helps you pay your tuition fees upfront, so you can study now and repay later. It supports hundreds of thousands of students each year—but it's important to understand how it works before you enrol. 5 ways to get motivated after school holidays

Getting back into school after holidays can feel rough. You've been sleeping in, staying up late and doing whatever you want, so switching back to school mode isn't easy. But you can get back on track with a few simple moves:

1. Fix your sleep - Start going to bed earlier and waking up at a normal time (even if it's painful at first).
2. Get organised - Pack your bag, sort your stuff, and feel a bit more in control.
3. Build a routine - Get back into a daily rhythm — it makes everything feel easier.
4. Just start - Don't overthink it. Even doing a little bit of work helps you get going.
5. Motivation isn't everything - You won't always feel like it — discipline > motivation. Just show up and do it.

How to improve your concentration

Concentration = staying focused and in control of your attention. Some people are naturally good at it but everyone can get better with practice. Easy ways to improve your focus:

- Sleep matters – it's way harder to focus when you're tired. Eat well and move your body too
- Set clear goals – make them specific (e.g. improve one grade in your next English test)
- Stick to a routine – same time, same place helps your brain switch into study mode
- Cut distractions – tidy desk, no TV, less phone = better focus
- Have a plan – know what you want to finish and tick it off as you go
- Write distractions down – deal with them later instead of stopping your work
- Start straight away – don't wait to "feel motivated"
- One thing at a time – multitasking = less focus
- Take breaks when needed – a quick walk can reset your brain

Bachelor of Dental Science (Honours)

If you are considering applying for entry to the Bachelor of Dental Science (Honours) program for Semester 1/2027 you should read the information on the [UQ website](#) and be aware that:

- Subject prerequisites of Queensland Year 12 (or equivalent) General English subject (Units 3 & 4, C); Chemistry (Units 3 & 4, C) and recommended Biology
- Sit the UCAT ANZ Aptitude test. The aggregate score from all 4 sections of the [University Clinical Aptitude Test \(UCAT\)](#) will be the first selection. Applicants with the same aggregate score are ranked by their UCAT ANZ section 4 score. If this score is also the same, the UCAT ANZ section 1 score is used
- Applicants without adjustments to their ATAR/tertiary rank will be considered before applicants with adjustments.
- The aggregate score from all four sections of the UCAT ANZ/UK will be applied as the primary differentiator to rank applications with ATAR 99.00 (or equivalent) or higher.

Did you know your VET studies can help you get into UQ?

At The University of Queensland, completed VET qualifications can be used to get a selection rank for entry. Here's what you could get:

- Certificate III (AQF) → Rank 68
- Certificate IV (AQF) → Rank 74
- Diploma (AQF) → Rank 82
- Sub-bachelor study → Rank depends on level, length & GPA

If you're in Year 12:

- You can use your VET qualification to apply for Semester 2 (the year after you graduate)
- You still need to pass any prerequisite subjects
